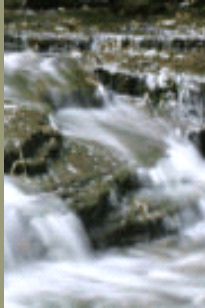

A Life Filled with Love

“Many waters cannot quench love; rivers cannot wash it away. If one were to give all the wealth of his house for love, it would be utterly scorned.” (Song of Solomon 8:7 NIV)

“And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love.
